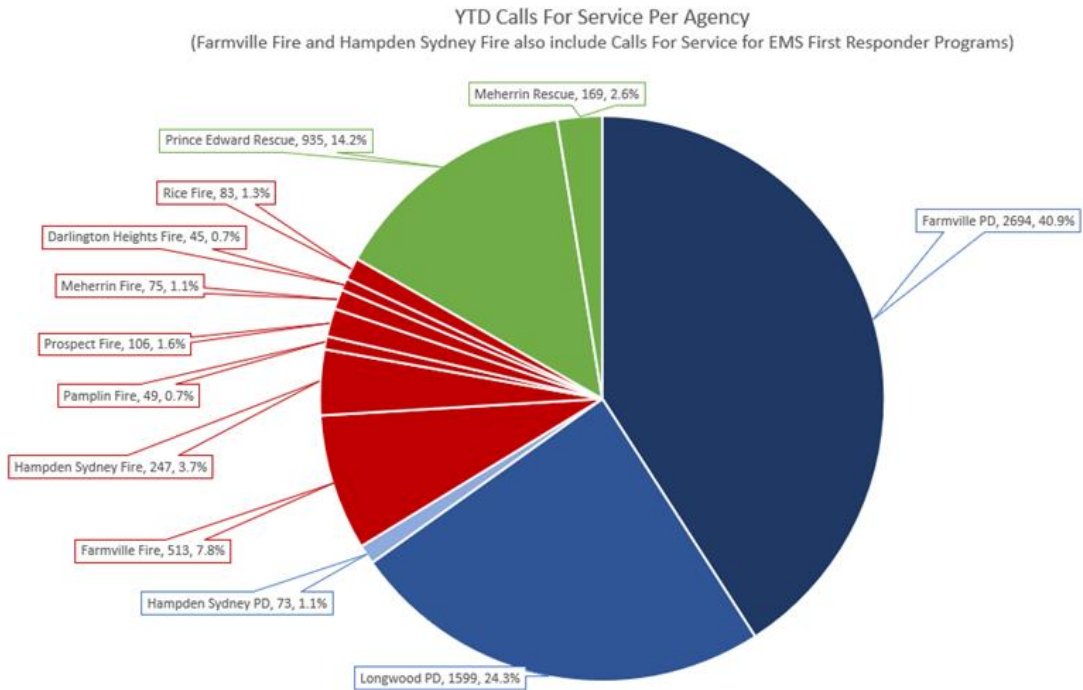
3. Supervisor Staff Meeting

4. Staffing

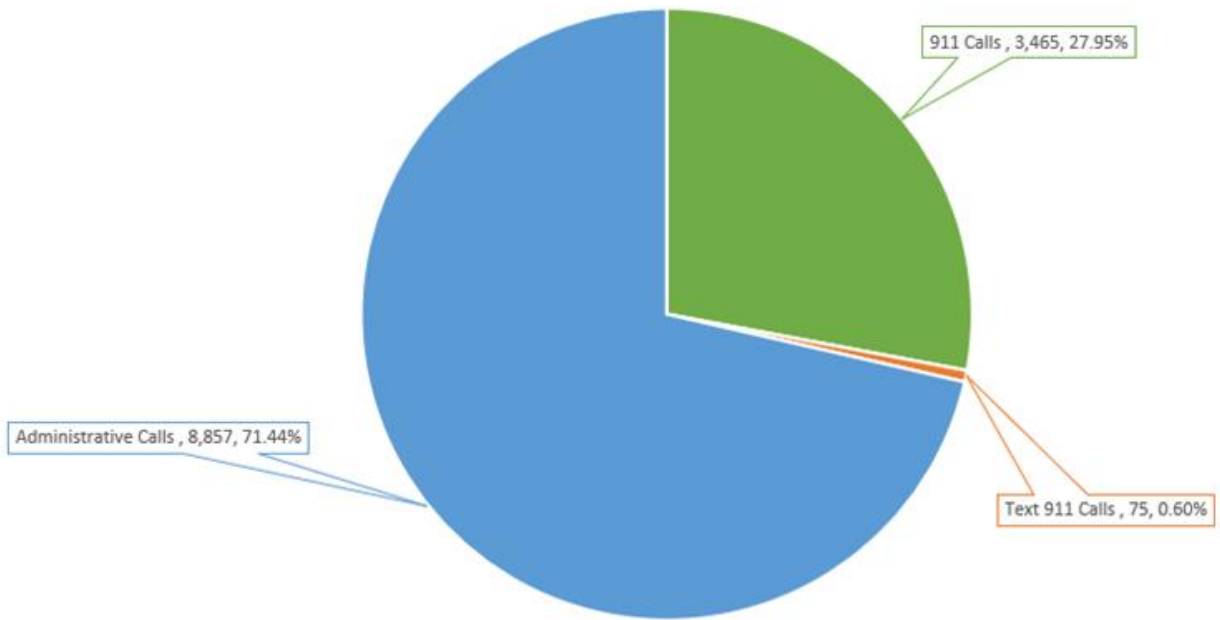
We are still down two full-time positions and one part-time position. We are working to fill these openings as soon as possible to maintain adequate staffing levels.

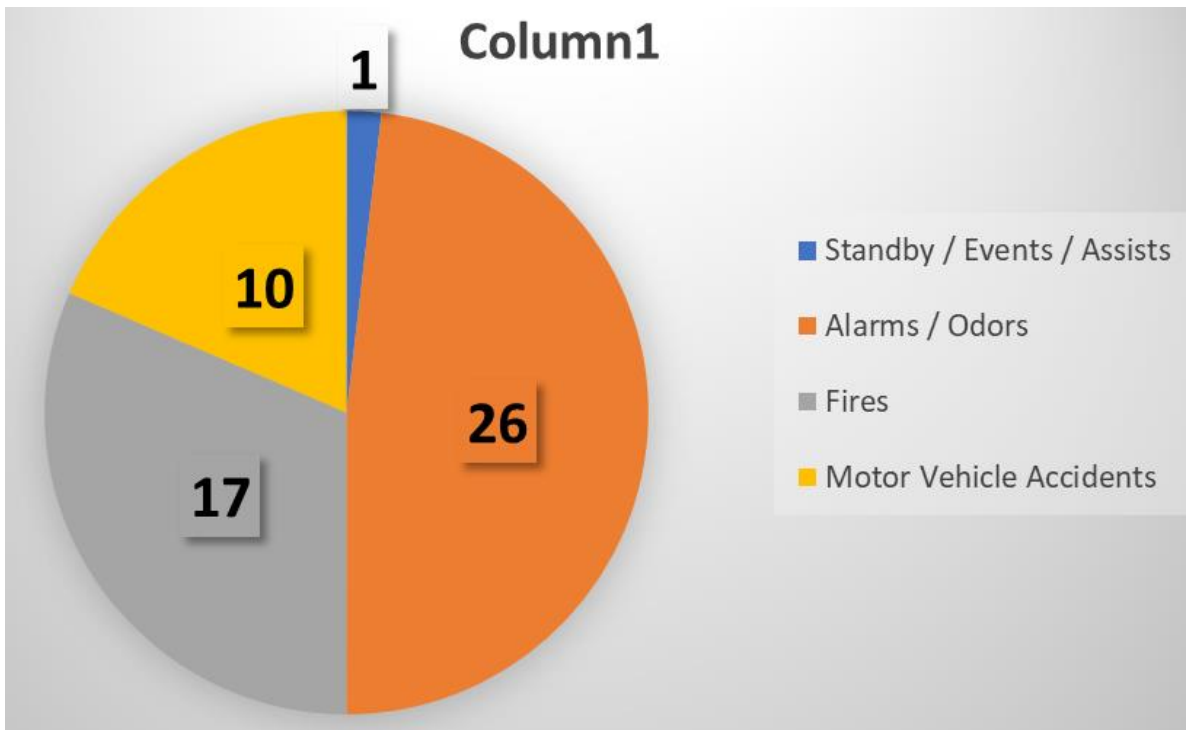
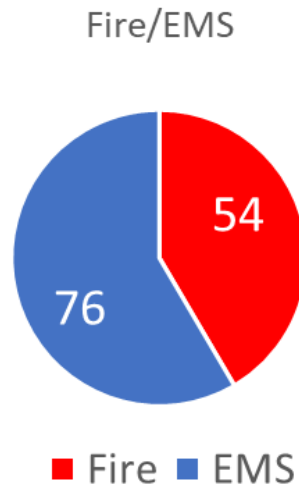

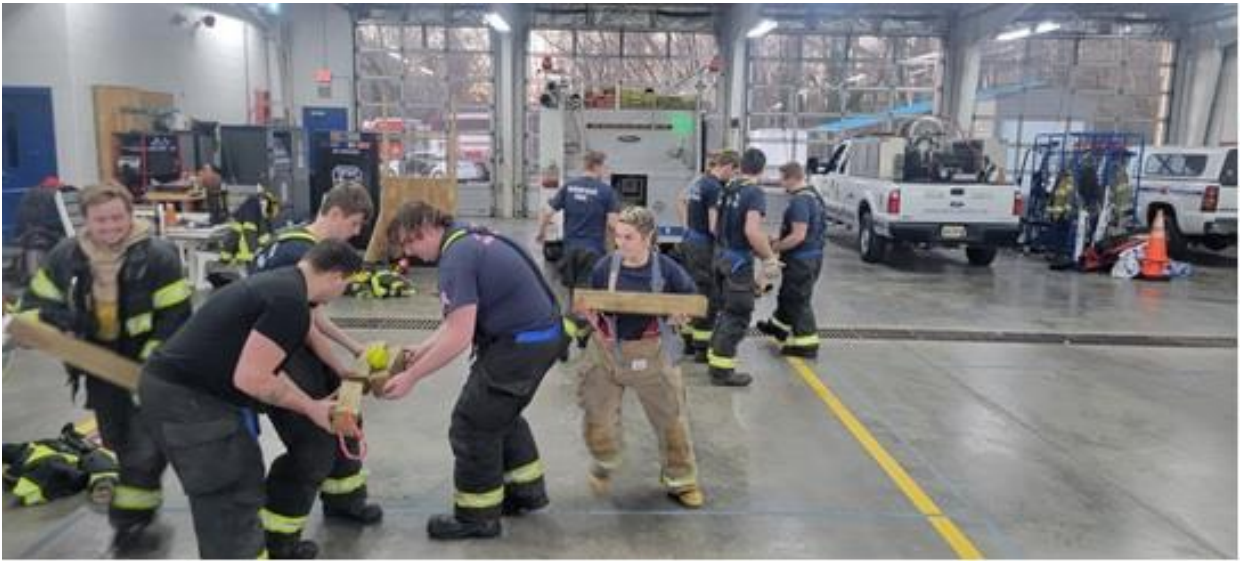
