We also had a bit of fun during Halloween, with our day shift team getting into the spirit and dressing up between calls boosting morale and camaraderie among coworkers.



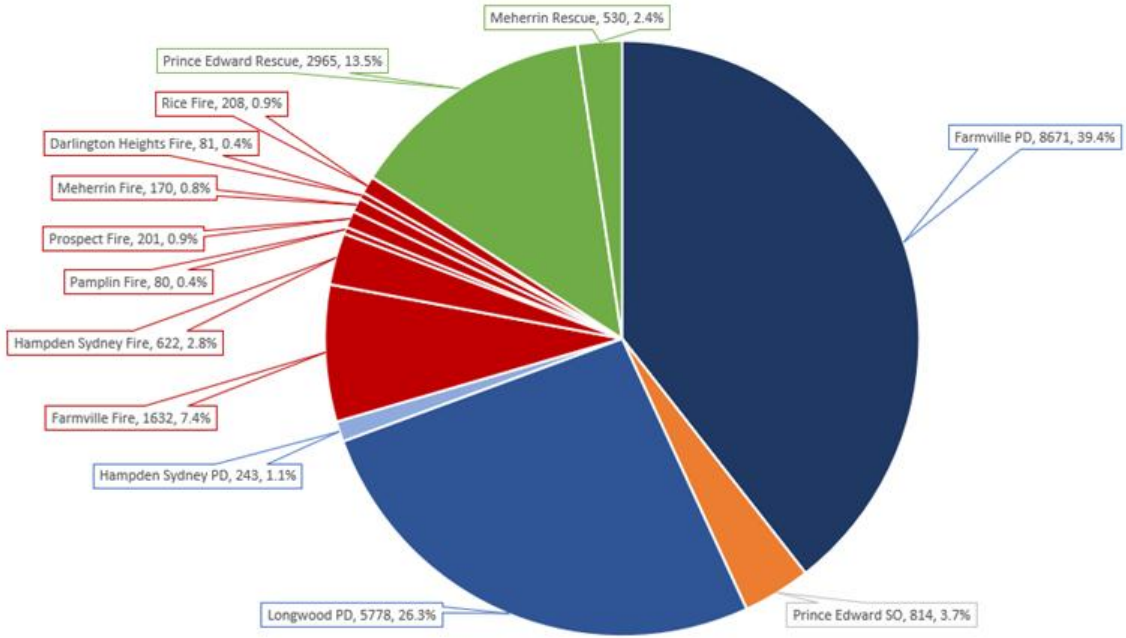
This month, we recognized several work anniversaries, including Timothy Seamster's 25 years of service. We're deeply grateful for his dedication to the Center and the community.
