We have hired a few new employees who are currently in training. Interviews are still being conducted with the goal of staffing five employees per shift.

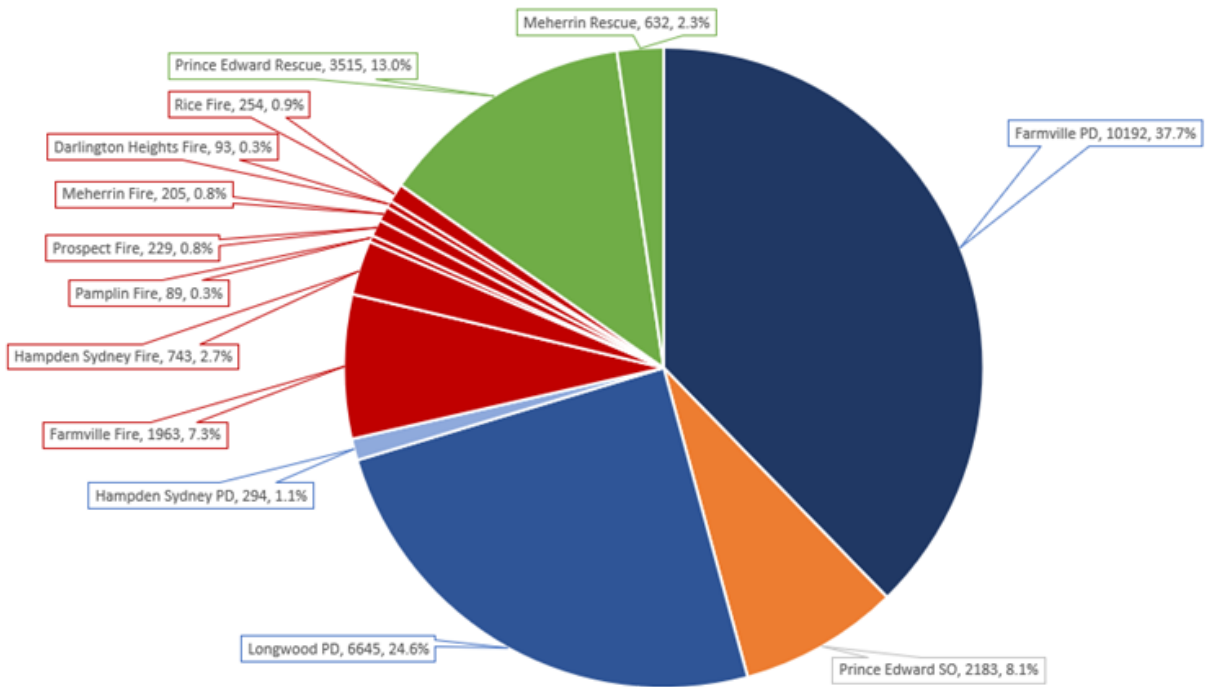
The fifth console was set up as a caller-taker and supervisor station to help support daily operations.

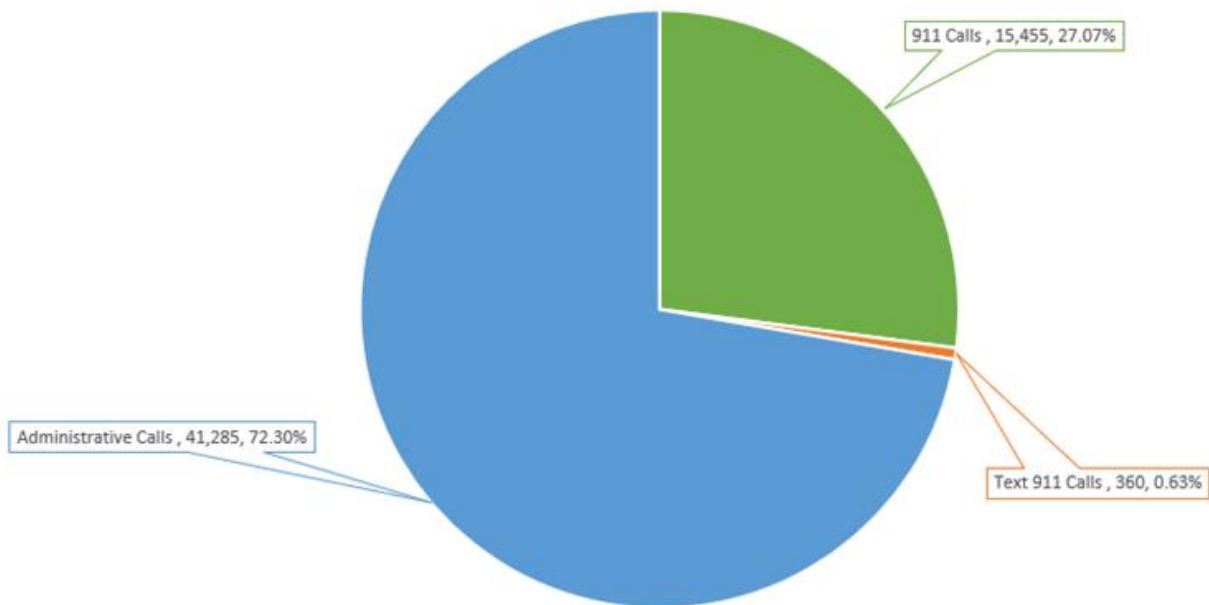

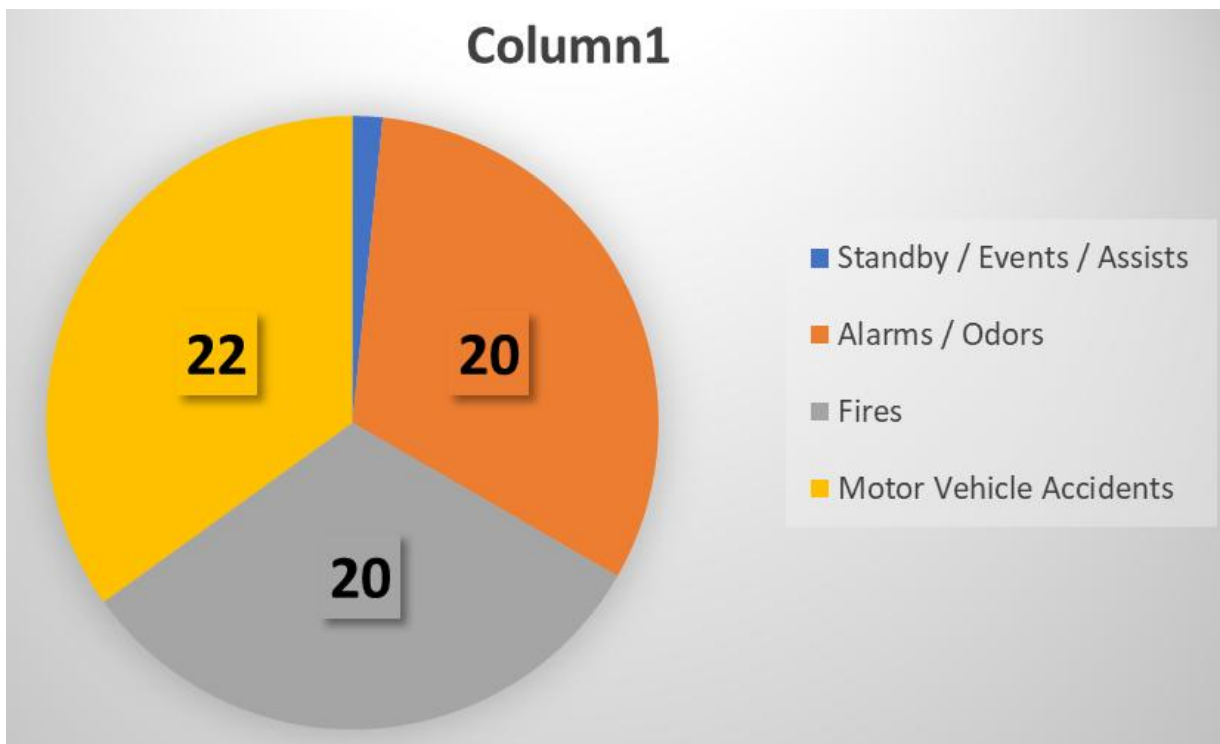
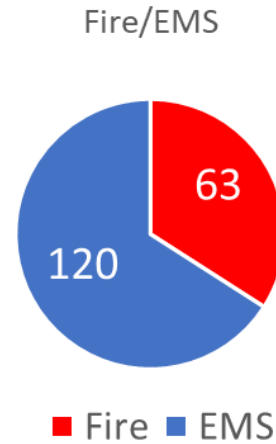
Total Agency Calls Answered YTD
